Notice of Confirmation of Public Path Order
Highways Act 1980

THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BEDFORDSHIRE (KNOTTING AND SOULDROP: PART OF BRIDLEWAY NO 11) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2006

On 26 November 2008 The Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs confirmed with minor modifications the above Order made under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the following length of public Bridleway No 11 Knotting and Souldrop as shown on the Order map.

The length of Bridleway No 11 Knotting and Souldrop to be stopped up extends from Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OS GR) TL 0055 6256 (Order map – point A) where it has a junction with Knotting Green Road, Knotting generally north east for approx 262 metres to OS GR TL 0079 6266 and then east south east for approx 50 metres to OS GR TL 0084 6265 (Order map – point C) where it has a junction with another part of Bridleway No 11 Knotting and Souldrop.

The length of Bridleway No 11 Knotting and Souldrop to be created extends from OS GR TL 0051 6268 (Order map – point D) where it has a junction with Knotting Green Road, Knotting generally north east across a field for approx 146 metres to OS GR TL 0064 6274 (Order map – point E) then generally south east along the field edge for approx 162 metres to OS GR TL 0078 6267 then south for approx 19 metres to OS GR TL 0078 6265 and then east for approx 55 metres to OS GR TL 0084 6265 (Order map – point C) where it has a junction with another part of Bridleway No 11 Knotting and Souldrop.

The new route of the bridleway has a width of 3.0 metres between OS GR TL 0051 6268 (Order map – point D) and OS GR TL 0064 6274 (Order map – point E) and a width of 4.0 metres between OS GR TL 0064 6274 (Order map – point E) and OS GR TL 0084 6265 (Order map – point C). There is a bridge at OS GR TL 0079 6265.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the Order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at the offices of Countryside Access Service, Bedfordshire County Council, County Hall, Bedford between 9.00am and 5.00pm Mondays to Thursdays and between 9.00am to 4.00pm Fridays. Copies of the Order and map may be bought there.

The Order comes into force on the date on which Bedfordshire County Council certify that the bridleway described in Article 2 of the Order has been set out to their satisfaction, but if a person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 14 December 2008 make an application to the High Court.
